We encourage and invite porosity and cross-pollination. The texts could fall within, between, or just on the cusp of food as a theme that is at once broad and deep. Here are but a few examples:

- food and emotion (joy, grief, desire)
- (mis)translations of food, or of recipes
- food and diaspora, conflict, war, peace
- culinary history, archeology, or food as archive
- food and identity, or food and memory
- food as muse, symbol, instrument

Excluding the originals, poems must not exceed ten pages. Prose, or other forms of writing should not be more than 2,500 words in length. If there is commentary, it should not exceed 500 words. Your submission, in text format, should not contain

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any formatting elements other than line breaks and indents. To be published, translations must be submitted with the original text, as well as written proof that permission to translate and publish the translation has been obtained. If the original text is to be published alongside the translation, written permission to publish said original must have been obtained as well. It is the translators' responsibility to obtain these permissions. Each submission should also contain short biographies of the author and the translator, to a maximum of 50 words each, and be included in the same Word document.
